## THE VISION: A MULTI-PURPOSE SPACE FOR CONNECTION

The project goal was clear: create a covered, multi-purpose athletic facility that could serve as more than just a basketball court. "We wanted something that could be used for pep rallies, evening programs, even DJ nights," he explained. "The idea was to have a place that brought camp together."

The final design delivered just that. The 80-by-120-foot covered court now features six basketball hoops, scoreboards, two large projection screens, and seating for up to 700 people. "It's a place where we host everything—from sports games to camp-wide events. It's much more than we imagined."

### CHOOSING LEGACY: A ONE-STOP PARTNER

When it came time to choose a builder, the directors were intentional about avoiding the complexity of managing multiple contractors. "We wanted a company that both built and erected the building," he said. "We didn't want to deal with subcontractors or the headaches that come with them."

After seeing tension fabric buildings at other camps, Camp Walden's leadership began exploring options, but most didn't fit the look or quality they envisioned. "I didn't like the look of the others," he admitted. "Legacy was more unique and different."

Like many projects in the Adirondacks, site conditions presented challenges. "Creating open, flat space here isn't easy," he recalled. "The foundation ended up costing twice as much as the building itself."

Despite these hurdles, the Legacy team's expertise helped Camp Walden bring their vision to life efficiently and on schedule. The structure's EpoxxiShield™ frame finish and ExxoTec™ Elite fabric provided durability, while features like industrial fans, LED lighting, and mesh ventilation created a bright, airy environment.

"The airflow is amazing," said the director. "Even on hot days, it's comfortable. And when it rains, the kids still have a place to go."

The building's impact extended beyond sports. "The energy in the building was unexpected," he reflected. "It's hard to describe—but it just brought everyone together. It's become a gathering spot that unites the entire camp."
